

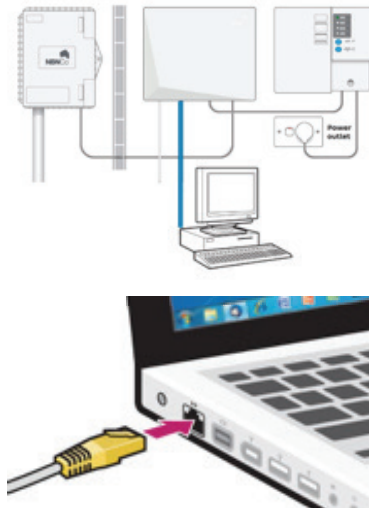
Testing a Bridge Connection to your Fixed Line Connection

Take your Ethernet cable (this is typically blue, yellow, grey or white) and plug one end into the active UNI-D port on your NBN Connection Box.

NOTE: The Ethernet cable is larger than the telephone cable. DO NOT use the telephone cable for an NBN connection)

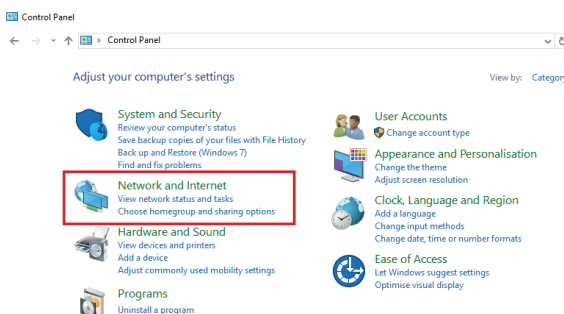


In most cases, the active port will be UNI-D 1. If a different UNI-D port was activated when your NBN equipment was installed, please use that one instead. Plug the other end into your computer's LAN / Ethernet port.

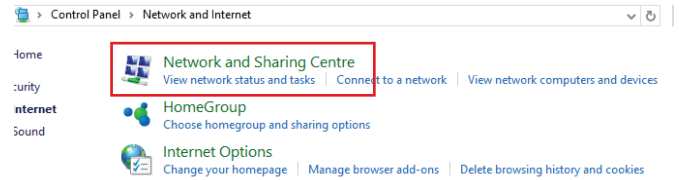


WINDOWS Operating System

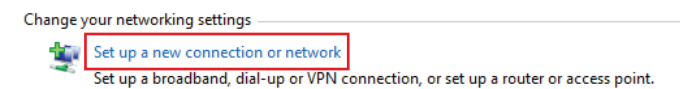
1. Go to "Control Panel", choose "Network and Internet"



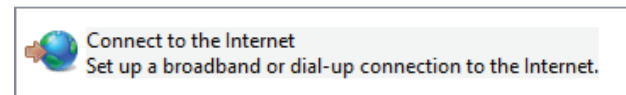
2. Click on "Network and Sharing Centre".



3. Click on "Set up a new connection or network".



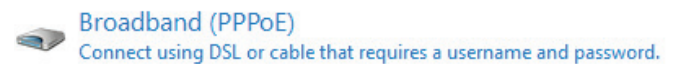
4. Click on "Connect to the Internet"



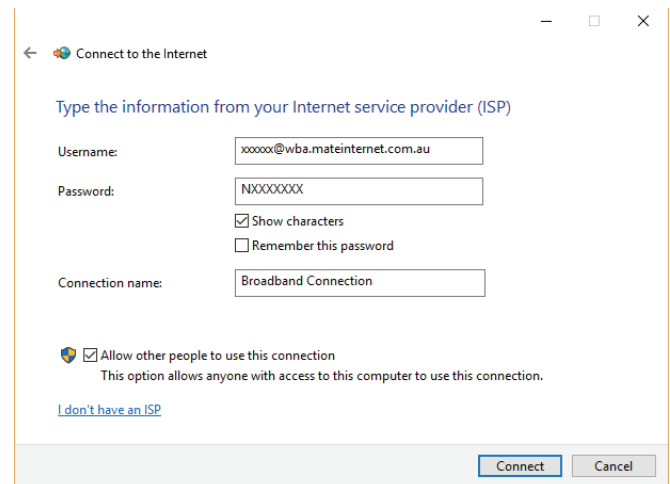
5. Click "set up a new connection anyway"

MAC OSX / Operating System

1. Go to System Preferences and click on Network.
2. Click the + button to add a new connection
3. Choose interface: PPPoE / Ethernet: Ethernet / Service Name: PPPoE
